You changed my mourning into dancing;
O LORD, my God, forever will I give you thanks.

— Psalm 30:13

Dear Immaculate Family,

Today's Gospel story is a story we can easily identify with. Each one of us has been through, is going through, or will go through a storm. And I am not just talking about the weather. Storms come in a various forms: personal crises, health issues, financial difficulties, relational conflicts, and so on. Life storms are for real and they always put our faith to the test. Today, we are invited to put our faith and trust in God in the middle of the storm. Faith doesn't prevent us from going through storms but assures us that we don't go through them alone. God is with us and He is stronger than any storm. That is today's message.

In the first reading, God speaks to Job out of the storm to remind him that He is the creator of the universe and has power over everything. Perhaps that wasn't the answer Job wanted to hear, but hearing the voice of God in the middle of the storm makes a big difference. In the Gospel, Jesus exercised that power by calming the storm for He is God.

I think the biggest sign in the story is not just Jesus changing the weather but Jesus staying on the same boat facing the storm with us. When we believe that Jesus in our same boat no matter what, even when he seems to be sleeping, we find strength and hope to keep up going. Even if the storm doesn't stop right away we are in peace.

It is interesting to notice that Jesus calms the storm by using the same words of his exorcisms: Quiet! Be still! Exorcisms are usually performed over people. Perhaps the worst of the storm is not outside but inside, in our fear, anxiety, despair, and desolation. It is in the heart where storms have first to be stilled. When you have God in your heart, no matter how violent the storm may be, you will find peace. Next time you face a storm, remember that God is with you, and He is in control. Every storm must come to pass. The storm may be above your head but every storm is under the feet of God. Do not just tell God how strong your storm is, rather tell the storm how strong your God is!

Querida familia de la Inmaculada:

La historia del Evangelio de hoy es una historia con la que podemos identificarnos fácilmente. Cada uno de nosotros ha pasado, está pasando o pasará por una tormenta. Y no me refiero sólo al tiempo. Las tormentas se presentan de diversas formas: crisis personales, problemas de salud, dificultades financieras, conflictos relacionales, etc. Las tormentas de la vida son reales y siempre ponen a prueba nuestra fe.

Hoy estamos invitados a poner nuestra fe y confianza en Dios en medio de la tormenta. La fe no nos impide atravesar tormentas, pero nos asegura que no las atravesamos solos. Dios está con nosotros y Él es más fuerte que cualquier tormenta. Ése es el mensaje de hoy. En la primera lectura, Dios le habla a Job desde la tormenta para recordarle que Él es el creador del universo y tiene poder sobre todo. Quizás esa no era la respuesta que Job quería escuchar, pero escuchar la voz de Dios en medio de la tormenta hace una gran diferencia. En el Evangelio, Jesús ejerció ese poder calmando la tormenta porque Él es Dios.

Creo que la señal más importante de la historia no es solo que Jesús cambie el clima, sino que Jesús permanezca en la misma barca enfrentando la tormenta con nosotros. Cuando creemos que Jesús está en nuestra misma barca pase lo que pase, incluso cuando parece estar durmiendo, encontramos fortaleza y esperanza para seguir adelante. Incluso si la tormenta no cesa de inmediato, estamos en paz.

Es interesante notar que Jesús calma la tormenta usando las mismas palabras de sus exorcismos: ¡Tranquilo! ¡Estate quieto! Los exorcismos suelen realizarse sobre personas. Quizás lo peor de la tormenta no esté afuera sino adentro, en nuestro miedo, ansiedad, desesperación y desolación. Es en el corazón donde primero hay que acallar las tormentas. Cuando tienes a Dios en tu corazón, por muy violenta que sea la tormenta, encontrarás paz.

La próxima vez que enfrentes una tormenta, recuerda que Dios está contigo y Él tiene el control. Cada tormenta debe pasar. La tormenta puede estar sobre tu cabeza pero toda tormenta está bajo los pies de Dios. ¡No le digas simplemente a Dios cuán fuerte es tu tormenta, más bien dile a la tormenta cuán fuerte es tu Dios!

¡Dios los bendiga a todos!

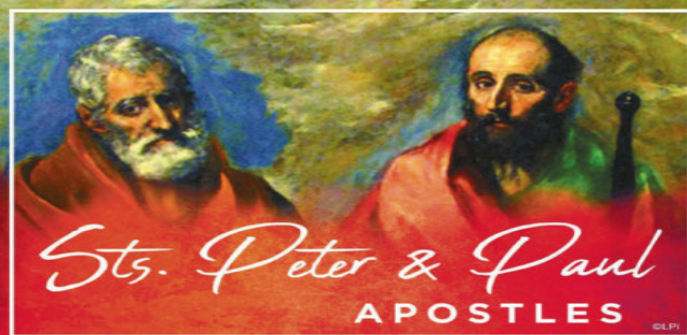

On the flipside, have any of you have sworn you're not going to demean yourself by explaining, for the thousandth time, that you need extra help with the kids before soccer practice, or that you feel ignored when your spouse doesn't ask how your day went? But sadly, love doesn't give you the ability to read minds. And in the end, we learn the lesson again and again, we have to verbalize our feelings, our needs, our wants. Expecting your partner to anticipate your needs is guaranteed to end badly.

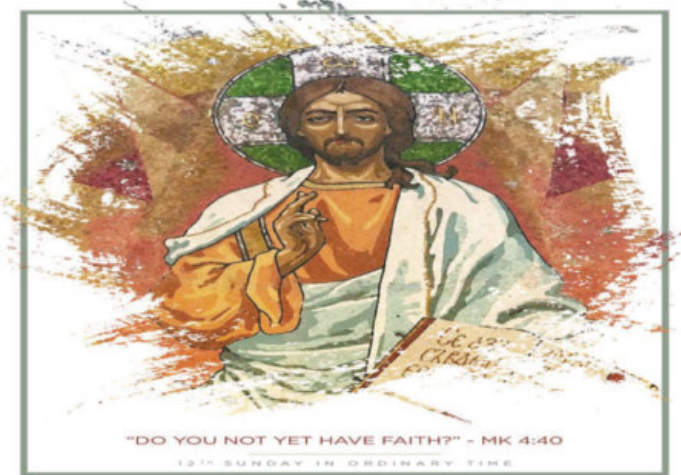
It's the same with God, even though, oddly enough, He does have the ability to read minds. But He still desires us to explain ourselves to Him, doesn't He? "I'm feeling scared of this." "I'm really worried about that." "God, I think I need x, y and z. Help me. Please." Jesus slept on that boat, as it was tossed and turned by the waves, until his disciples woke him. "Why were you sleeping?" they ask. Well, geniuses, he was sleeping because they hadn't woken him up yet. They had wasted time cowering in fear, waiting for him to act. They gave him the silent treatment and they didn't even know it.

God doesn't desire us to verbalize our needs as a way of keeping us submissive. He's not that petty. What He desires is the communication — that's what really counts. That act of opening yourself up, of becoming vulnerable, of relying on Him, trusting Him. If it feels like God is asleep in your life, ask yourself this, have you tried waking Him up?

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Right now, you and I are only worried about one of only two things: wind or water. Bear with me. This week we hear the account of the terrified disciples waking Jesus in a sea-storm. He chastises them for their lack of faith, and then, "rebuking the wind, he said to the sea, 'Quiet, be still!'" He rebukes the wind and stills the water. In the Bible wind and water represent the two most fundamental poles of our experience of creation. Wind means heaven, spirit, that which gives identity, unity, order, light. Water stands for earth, variation, potential, that which can be drawn into identity, darkness, chaos.

Too much "wind" is when things get way too rigid, abstract and ideological — when we face oppressive leaders and tyrants, when we get addicted to our own way of doing things, when our attention is too narrowly focused on one thing. Too much "water" is excessive novelty, passivity, indifference, and chaos — when our attention is too broadly diffused on many things, when things seem to be crumbling without direction into the dark abyss. We know both terrifying experiences all too well.

The point of the miracle is that God in Christ is the One who brings final cosmic harmony between these two vital but threatening forces. He ultimately does so from the wood of the cross, when he breathes forth the wind of his spirit and pours forth the water from his side to establish a new creation, filled with harmonious peace. When the wind and water are out of control, trust him.

MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO

Por lo regular, cuando una persona está en problemas serios, tiende a sentirse sin rumbo y perdida. Estar en medio de la tormenta de la vida conlleva a tomar el timón y guiar hacia la calma. Pero, ¿Cómo hacerlo? ¿A quién dirigimos? En el Evangelio de hoy, los discípulos estuvieron en medio de una fuerte tormenta y se asustaron, y llenos de miedo despiertan a Jesús. Enseguida vienen las preguntas: “Maestro ¿no te importa que nos hundamos? Él entonces se despertó. Se encaró con el viento y dijo al mar: Cállate, cálmate”. El viento se apaciguó y siguió una gran calma. Después les dijo: ¿Por qué son tan miedosos? ¿Todavía no tienen fe? (Marcos 4:38-40).

El susto de los discípulos, primero, de morir ahogados, y seguido, de ver quien era Jesús que hasta el viento y el mar le obedecían. Y Jesús, sorprendido de su falta de fe, a pesar de estar junto a él, les reprende su falta de confianza en Dios. Nosotros, también, hemos estado en situaciones difíciles en nuestra vida. El miedo y la incertidumbre al perder un ser querido, el trabajo, el de emigrar a otro país dejándolo todo. Pero, si creemos en Jesús, debemos de mantener siempre viva la esperanza, porque toda nuestra vida, queramos o no, está en manos de Dios. ¿De qué nos puede reprender Jesús ahora? ¿Cuáles son mis miedos más apremiantes? Sea lo que sea, que nunca cese nuestra oración, porque al orar, Dios vendrá en nuestro auxilio y todo tipo de situaciones tormentosas serán manejables.

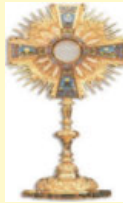

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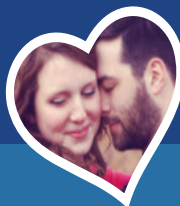


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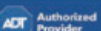
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
